9	For what purpose or project is the grant requested?	The grant will be used to hire an explorer-dome (plus staff) for a science-themed evening that will be attended by around 90 local Girlguiding members (aged 5 – 14) plus our adult volunteers.
		The Bristol-based "Explorer-dome" company will set up a mobile planetarium in the Younghayes Centre and run 3 x 1hr age-appropriate space-themed sessions over the course of an evening for the Rainbows, Brownies and Guides respectively.

10	What are the project's aims?	The aim of the event is to enable local Girlguiding members to take part in interactive science-based activities in a unique and memorable way that they are unlikely to experience at school.
11	Please evidence demand for this project:	Despite great progress in promoting diversity across all branches of science women are still a minority in many scientific professions (particularly in the

		fields of physics and engineering). Girlguiding is always keen to promote equal opportunities to its young members and by providing this opportunity to engage with scientists in a female-only space we will give our Rainbows, Brownies and Guides the confidence to get involved in a way that they may not feel so comfortable doing in the traditional (mixed) school environment. This is particularly important for older members of our Guide unit who are at the stage of considering their GCSE subjects and future career paths.
		Previous smaller-scale science and engineering activities that we have run in our Girlguiding sessions have shown that there is a clear enthusiasm for these types of activities in a non-academic setting. We are therefore certain that this event will benefit all of our members. Maximum 300 words

13	How is financial sustainability being achieved in the long term?	This is a one-off event designed to bring all 90 Cranbrook Girlguiding members together for a one-off science-themed evening. Our standard unit running costs are budgeted for and covered by our termly subscriptions of ~£35 per child per term.

15	How will the community benefit from the project?	The Girlguiding community will benefit from the educational aspects of the event as it provides a learning experience in a non-academic setting.

		The activities provided by the company are aligned with the national curriculum, with the content of each 1 hour session aligned with the relevant key-stage of the age group attending.	
		Hosting this event locally during one of our regular evening meetings means that it is accessible to all our members at no additional cost. The explorer dome hire cost is the same as the price for 90 children + adult volunteers to attend a similar interactive event at our nearest science museum (located in Bristol) but the cost of transport would at least double this price. Events at the Sidmouth planetarium are a similar price but the capacity at this site and the need for parents to take their child there by car would stop a significant number of the children attending.
