
As we move in to the Budget-setting month at Devon County Council, it has been just as difficult as in previous years to be able to present a Budget to full council later this month, which balances and provides the best taxpayer value for council services.

The table below gives an idea on where the £784 million council payer money goes; where 79% alone goes to Adult and Children services, which greatly reduces the amount available for other things that matter most to residents, such as roads and public transport. The DCC part of Council tax bill is proposed to rise by 4.99%, which includes 2% for social care, but is less than some other councils.

DCC is the least well-funded County Council in England and the next increase in what is termed 'core funding' for 2025/26 is 2.6%, around the current rate of inflation

3.5 This report provides detailed budget proposals in line with these targets. The following graph indicates the relative proportion of budgets between directorates. Integrated Adult Social Care and Children and Young People's Futures combined continue to deliver 79% of total net costs in our services.



This is set against a period of uncertainty in terms of Local Government, which is likely to see the end of District Councils and the County Council in Devon, replaced
